



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### **CAISU** training


- All officers are qualified PIP2 detectives or are working towards this qualification
- Mentoring programme on joining
- SCAIDP- Specialist child abuse investigation development programme- one week course- training includes registered intermediaries, child death, initial contacts, CSA, CSE etc
- Optional Tier 3/5 interview training

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### Terminology


- Wilful = deliberate or reckless act or failure
- Assault = common assault not enough by itself to prove this offence
- III-treat- course of conduct required
- Neglect-physical, emotional, mental, medical, nutritional, educational
- Abandonment- leaving a child/young person
- Exposure- not required to prove they intended to injury, just there is the possibility.







### What happens when reported to Police via 999/101?








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#### What happens when reported to Police via a referral?







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### Neglect Outcomes


- Large number of cases don't meet charging standards
- Alternative offences considered
- Out of court disposal- community resolution/ conditional cautions
- Sentencing penalties
  - Summary- MAX 12 months imprisonment and/or a fine
  - Indictment- Max 14 years imprisonment and/or a fine



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## Case Study 1



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#### Neglect

- 21mth old boy at home alone with mum who was heavily intoxicated, asleep and unable to care for child.
- Reported by partner who returned from work at 7pm and found child covered in rubbish from the bin, wife passed out.
- Officers attend, child dirty, mum still asleep heavily intoxicated.
- Mum blew 150ug drink drive limit is 35ug breath sample.
- Admission in interview to drinking heavily whilst sole adult with care of the child, acknowledging alcohol abuse and supportive of referral this.
- Referral to CSC, no Strat was held.
- Mum got a Conditional Caution Comply with Alcohol Awareness course, Thinking Skills course and CGL assessment.
